QUESTION AND ANSWER WITH NAMES NOTED BY CHAIRPERSON - CLINICAL MEETING ON 15.05.2014

1. **Question:** - What is Hard Stop? (Dr. B.R.K. Rao, Professor of Ophthalmology).
Answer: - In hard stop block is in nasolacrimal duct. Soft stop block is in canaliculus (Dr. Tejaswi, PG in ENT)

2. **Question:** - Can this be Congenital? (Dr. P. Krishna Murthy, Professor of General Surgery).
Answer: - It is acquired atresia as she was asymptomatic till age of 22. Chronic infection sometimes leads to fibrosis & atretic of sac (Dr. P.S. Sukthankar, Professor of ENT).

3. **Question:** - What is normal histology of Nasolacrimal duct? (Dr. A.K. Deshpande, Assoc. Professor of Pathology).
Answer: Ciliated Pseudostratified columnar epithelium in nasolacrimal duct and stratified squamous epithelium in canaliculus (Dr. A.K. Deshpande, Assoc. Professor of Pathology).

4. **Question:** - How long syringing to be done? What are causes of recurrence? (Dr. Samar Zia, Asst. Professor of Obst & Gynaecology).
Answer: - Syringing to be done once of week for 1 month and once a month for next 6 months, Recurrence may be due to any granulation synechia (Dr. M. Deepthi, Asst. Professor of ENT).
